Launching Service for Tutakimoa Meeting House Renovation, Betelehema III

On Monday the 26th of August 2024, members of the Tutakimoa community and



CICC Avarua Ekalesia including representatives from Takamoa, project leaders, managers and landowners all attended a special service Tutakimoa down the meeting house known as Betelehema III, as a final and launching service. before renovations of the building commences.

Makirere Poila, leading deacon

for Tutakimoa of the Avarua CICC Ekalesia shared. "it has been 38 years since Betelehema III was renovated. 1986. in and throughout that time period had experienced rot through the ceiling and roofing structure of the building, hence the need for renovations that will be conducted Taio by Constructions".

This project was made possible through the re-affirmation of support from the landowners, in gifting the land for the building and funds granted by the government of India to the Cook Islands, a portion of that fund, was granted to the community of Tutakimoa for the renovation project of their meeting house. A three-member committee was set-up for the supervision of renovations project headed by Vasie Ngatoko Poila as Project leader.



The service ended with refreshments prepared by the Tutakimoa community, taking a final look of the building before construction takes place, and awaiting what it will look like after renovation.

Aside from all the mind draining lecture's, we did enjoy praise and worship at the beginning and end of each day. We also enjoyed a full day of


