

**GUIDELINES FOR EXPENDITURES OF MINISTERS, RETIRED MINISTERS AND
STUDENT GRADUATES ATTENDING THE CICC BIENNIAL ASSEMBLIES**

I. Ministers

- a) Attendance to the assembly – full return cost to be borne by the Ekalesia if it is not a rotation assembly. If it is, the following conditions apply.
- b) If returning to his original Ekalesia first before moving into new Ekalesia – Ekalesia bears the return cost to the assembly, Takamoā bears the cost to move the minister, his wife and 2 children under 18, into their new Ekalesia.
- c) If going straight to his new Ekalesia after the assembly – Ekalesia bears the one-way cost to the assembly, Takamoā bears the cost of moving him into his new Ekalesia, plus the cost of his wife and 2 children under 18.
- d) Freight: Takamoā will bear freight costs of up to \$1,000 for international exchanges (i.e. Cook Is/Australia, Cook Is/NZ, NZ/Australia), and up to \$500 for local/domestic exchanges (i.e. within NZ, within Cook Is, within Australia).
- e) Any cost in excess of the above, shall be borne by the minister himself and/or his Ekalesia.

II. Student graduates

- f) The situation with student graduates attending the assembly is similar to that of the minister. A student graduate, including ordained ministers who do not yet have an Ekalesia, are automatically members of the assembly. Their full return cost is the responsibility of their respective Ekalesias if attending a non-rotation assembly.
- g) If attending a rotation assembly where they are scheduled to be ordained and from there move into an Ekalesia earmarked for them, then conditions (b) to (d) above apply.

III. Retired Ministers

- h) Attendance of the retired ministers to the assemblies is optional. While they are automatically members of the assembly, their attendance is a matter for the Ekalesia to decide since it is the Ekalesia who will bear the fare costs.
